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Research Grants/Fellowships

Scheme: ICMR | Centre for Advanced Research (CAR) – Development of Priority Medical Devices and Diagnostic Technologies

Details: The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has launched a special call for the establishment of Centres for Advanced Research (CARs) to accelerate the development of indigenous, affordable, and regulatory-compliant medical devices and diagnostic technologies addressing priority unmet clinical needs in India. The initiative aims to strengthen the national MedTech ecosystem by supporting mission-oriented translational research and technology development programs with strong commercialization potential.

Applicants are required to propose the development of 8–10 priority medical devices and diagnostic technologies selected from an ICMR-curated list of approximately 100 unmet clinical need-based technologies identified through extensive consultations with clinicians and healthcare stakeholders across the country. The program seeks to foster innovation, technology translation, regulatory readiness, and commercialization, ultimately contributing to healthcare self-reliance and improved public health outcomes. Institutions with established MedTech innovation and startup ecosystems. Teams with demonstrated experience in product development and commercialization. Proposals involving technologies that have already reached Technology Readiness Level (TRL) 3 or 4 and above, increasing the likelihood of successful translation within the project period.

Scope: Research Focus Areas:

- Development of priority medical devices addressing unmet clinical needs
- Diagnostic technologies for healthcare applications
- Regulatory-compliant product development and validation
- Translational research and commercialization of healthcare technologies
- Indigenous MedTech innovation and manufacturing
- Technology development from prototype to market-ready solutions

Budget & Duration: Funding support of up to ₹15 Crore per Centre for duration of up to 5 years.

Scheme: ICMR | NIDDK Indo-US Collaborative Research on Precision Diabetes – Expression of Interest (EoI)

Details: The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has invited Expressions of Interest (EoI) from Indian investigators to identify existing diabetes and metabolic disease cohorts for participation in the ICMR–NIDDK (National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases, USA) Indo-US Collaborative Research Programme on heterogeneity of diabetes and precision diabetes. The initiative aims to leverage well-characterized Indian and U.S. cohorts to advance the understanding of diabetes subtypes, disease progression, treatment response, and complications, ultimately enabling precision medicine approaches.

** Applicants are requested to allow at least 2 weeks before submission deadline for RDO to carry out necessary due diligence on outgoing applications.*

Investigators with existing cohort datasets are invited to submit details of their cohorts, including clinical, metabolic, and longitudinal variables, along with a brief note describing the cohort and its relevance to the programme. Shortlisted investigators will be invited to participate in collaborative protocol development with Indian and U.S. researchers for future jointly funded research proposals.

Scope: Research Focus Areas are

- Diabetes heterogeneity and precision diabetes research
- Existing Indian cohorts on diabetes and related metabolic disorders
- Clinical, metabolic, and longitudinal cohort data harmonization
- Indo-US collaborative research proposal development
- Identification of biomarkers, disease subtypes, treatment response, and complications
- International collaboration to advance precision medicine for diabetes

Eligibility: Principal Investigators from Indian academic, research, and healthcare institutions with existing diabetes or metabolic disease cohorts. Cohorts should have relevant clinical, phenotypic, and longitudinal data and investigators willing to participate in Indo-US collaborative research and data harmonization.

Scheme: ICMR | Follow-on Research Grant under the Intramural Research Programme-2026

Details: The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) has launched the Follow-on Research Grant under its Intramural Research Programme to support the advancement of promising research outcomes towards technology development and commercialization. The scheme is designed to bridge the gap between the initial research funding phase and market translation by enabling investigators to build upon successful outcomes from previously funded ICMR intramural projects. The proposed follow-on project must be directly linked to a prior ICMR-funded intramural grant and should demonstrate clear incremental research, technology maturation, or innovation development with potential for commercialization.

Scope: Research Focus Areas:

- Advancement of promising research leads from previous ICMR intramural projects
- Development of innovative technologies and products
- Translational research and technology validation
- Commercialization of research outcomes
- Incremental research to enhance existing ICMR-funded innovations
- Bridging the gap between proof-of-concept and market-ready technologies

Eligibility: ICMR intramural researchers with previously funded ICMR intramural research projects. Proposed projects must be linked to an earlier ICMR grant and demonstrate incremental scientific or technological advancement.

Budget & Duration: Up to ₹8 Crore per project for a maximum duration of 3 years

Scheme: LAB TO MARKET(L2M) PROGRAM (Medical Device Development & Validation)

Details: The L2M initiative has been launched to accelerate the adaptation of market-ready medical devices by translating innovative technologies developed in academic laboratories into practical healthcare solutions. The technology readiness level (TRL) of academic endeavours ranges 6 and above, and most projects culminate at the proof-of-concept stage. Constraints in terms of time, budget, and resources impede the transformation of the prototype to the marketplace. The L2M initiative of IIT Indore DRISHTI CPS Foundation aims to identify high-potential prototypes for accelerating the transfer of an academic innovation to the marketplace.

Scope of the call: Focus Areas includes:

- Medical Devices & Smart Healthcare Systems
- Wearables & Continuous Monitoring Technologies
- Sensors & Patient Data Acquisition Systems
- Point-of-Care Diagnostics

Budget: Upto INR 150 Lakhs

Scheme: ANRF | Mission for Advancement in High-impact Areas (MAHA) – Water Program

Details: The MAHA Water Program is a mission-mode research initiative designed to address India's critical water challenges through interdisciplinary, multi-institutional, and solution-oriented research. The program aims to accelerate innovation, technology development, policy integration, and stakeholder engagement to ensure sustainable water security, improve water quality, enhance water-use efficiency, and strengthen climate resilience. To ensure sustainable, equitable, and resilient water security by conserving and augmenting water resources, improving water quality, enhancing efficient water use across sectors, and strengthening governance and community participation in the context of climate change and growing water demand. Key objectives of this scheme are to accelerate innovation in the water sector through collaboration among academia, industry, entrepreneurs, and communities and support technology development and validation from TRL-2 to TRL-6/7. Proposals must be submitted in consortium mode involving multiple investigators and institutions.

Scope: Following Thematic Areas:

- Water Resource Assessment and Sustainable Management
- Drinking Water
- Water Quality, Human and Ecological Health
- Water Use Efficiency and Circular Economy
- Climate Resilience and Adaptation

Indo-International Grants

Scheme: CEFIPRA | Collaborative Scientific Research Programme (CSRP) – Project / Seminar

Details: CSRP scheme provides funding support to academic collaborative (between India and France) research projects in the areas of fundamental and applied science. Inclusion of only one Co-Principal Investigator (Co-PI) on the Indian side and one Co-PI on the French side is permitted, each from the same institution as the respective Principal Investigator (PI). This modification shall apply to new proposals submitted under subsequent calls. Based on project requirements, additional Co-PIs (more than 1) from other institution(s) may be included; however, such inclusion shall not entail any additional financial support from CEFIPRA.

Scope of this Call: Focused areas for collaborative projects under the current call are

Scheme: CEFIPRA | Industry-Academia Research & Development Programme (IARDP)

Details: To support collaborative research programme involving Industry & Academia of France and India. To promote the development of new processes or products or the improvement of existing processes or products, through industry centric proposal focusing its need for society benefit. It's expected that the proposed ideas should have deliverables like demonstration of proof concept & prototype building up to Technology Readiness Level (TRL 4-5). The proposals must be innovative and industry-driven towards the development or substantial improvement of new products, processes, etc. The project proposals submitted in the framework of this programme should preferably involve at least one industrial partner and one research institute each from India & France preferably (2+2 Model).

Scope: Thrust areas as below:

- Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning (Supercomputing, Cloud Computing, Artificial Intelligence, Digital Health)
- Renewable & Clean Energy (Hydrogen, Renewable Energy Technologies Solar & Wind Power, Decarbonization)

Scheme: DST/JSPS | Bilateral Joint Research Projects/Seminars

Details: The Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) carries out bilateral cooperative programs between Japan and counterpart countries based on agreements concluded with academies, research councils and other science-promotion institutions in those countries. The aim of these programs is to form sustained networks of bilateral research teams (etc.) evolved from individual scientist exchanges. JSPS provides financial support to excellent Japanese scientists, including young scientists, implementing such bilateral joint research projects and seminars with research teams from counterpart countries.

There are **two types of Bilateral Joint Research Projects/Seminars:**

- A. Bilateral Joint Research Projects/Seminars with JSPS's Counterpart Agencies
- B. Open Partnership Joint Research Projects/Seminars.

The latter provides Japanese researchers an opportunity to conduct research or hold a seminar with researchers who reside in any country that has diplomatic relations with Japan.

Eligibility: As per the scheme guidelines, the application from Indian and Japanese PIs must submit the same project proposal to the respective authorities responsible for the implementation of the Executive Programme. Proposals from Indian PI must be submitted to DST.

Scheme: JSPS | International Fellowships for Research in Japan (FY 2027–2028)

Details: The Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) invites applications for its International Fellowships for Research in Japan, providing opportunities for outstanding overseas researchers to conduct collaborative research with leading Japanese universities and research institutions. The programme aims to strengthen international scientific collaboration, advance research excellence, and promote the internationalization of Japanese research across the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.

Scope: Collaborative research in all disciplines, including:

- Natural Sciences
- Engineering and Technology
- Medical and Life Sciences

Eligibility: Overseas researchers nominated by an eligible **Japanese host researcher** affiliated with a Japanese university or research institution.

- **Postdoctoral Fellowships:** Researchers who have obtained (or are expected to obtain) a PhD within the prescribed eligibility period.
- **Invitational Fellowships: Established overseas researchers** with an outstanding research record and an academic position at a foreign university or research institution.

Financial Support & Duration: The fellowship comprises four categories

- **Postdoctoral Fellowship (Standard):** 12–24 months with a maintenance allowance of **JPY 362,000/month**, round-trip airfare, settling-in allowance, and overseas travel insurance.
- **Postdoctoral Fellowship (Short-term):** 1–12 months with a maintenance allowance of up to **JPY 362,000/month**, round-trip airfare, settling-in allowance (for eligible fellows), and research support allowance.
- **Invitational Fellowship (Long-term):** 2–10 months with a maintenance allowance of **JPY 387,600/month**, round-trip airfare, overseas travel insurance, and research support allowance.
- **Invitational Fellowship (Short-term):** 14–60 days with travel and subsistence support as per JSPS guidelines.

International Grants

Scheme: Velux Stiftung | Challenges in Forest Management call for Proposals 2026

Details: The call is focussed on developing innovative solutions for climate change adaptation and biodiversity recovery that advance integrative sustainable forest management, while ensuring resilient ecosystems services and the supply of sustainable forest products. Incentives or tools that translate the often intangible values of forests and ecosystem services into concrete drivers for behavioural change towards sustainable forest management

Scope of the Call: Support is available for two different project types:

- **Research projects (generating new knowledge):** Novel, outside-of-the-box research which demonstrates potential to shift forestry practice– At least two partners from different organisations (e.g. universities) needed, second partner can be a stakeholder organisation– Project would not be possible without involving stakeholders from the outset of the project– At least 10% of the budget to be spent on knowledge transfer – On approaches of general interest that can be scaled
- **Science-practice projects (transfer of existing knowledge):** At least two partners from different organisations needed, one partner needs to be a stakeholder organisation– Project enables the transfer of evidence-based forest management findings to practitioners (without being an implementation project)– Produces specific deliverables such as tools or resources – Needs upfront commitment of collaborating partners– Needs plans for continuity beyond the project period

Eligibility: Open to researchers and research teams globally (subject to Velux Stiftung eligibility criteria).

Duration & Budget: Up to max. CHF 100000 per year for one to four years, can be requested

Scheme: Velux Stiftung | Ophthalmology call for Proposals 2026

Details: The long-term vision of the program is to contribute to reducing visual impairments and blindness in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) by developing and strengthening research capacity, with a focus on research institutions. It aims to reinforce biomedical/clinical ophthalmology research locally in a sustainable manner and to strengthen research ownership. In this way, research institutions in LMICs can build scientific reputation, enabling them to retain and attract excellent researchers.

Scope of the Call: Institutional research capacity strengthening (IRCS) projects: projects aiming at sustainably building, developing, or strengthening institutional structures that enable biomedical/clinical ophthalmology research in LMICs. Note that IRCS aspects need to be at the core of your proposal.

Eligibility: Open to researchers and research teams globally (subject to Velux Stiftung eligibility criteria). Projects must adopt an interdisciplinary approach, ideally combining disciplines that rarely collaborate. Applicants should demonstrate the ability to translate research into real-world impact. Consortia of research groups with at least one partner based in a LMIC are invited to apply. The involvement of a high-income country (HIC) partner in the consortium is welcome but not mandatory. Most of the research should take place in one or several LMICs.

Duration & Budget: Up to max. USD 75000 per year for a total of USD 300000, with at least 50 % of the funding to be used in LMICs, and at least 40 % of the funding to be used for IRCS activities.

Travel Fellowships

Scheme: DHR | Short-Term Fellowship Abroad (STFA)

Eligibility: Indian citizens working in recognized academic/research institutions in India with MBBS/BDS/MVSc/MSc/MPharma/MTech (or equivalent) with PhD in biomedical/health research. Minimum 3 years of teaching/research experience after required qualification and should not have availed a similar Government fellowship in the last 3 years

Age Limit: Below 57 years

Duration: 15 days to 3 months

Eligibility: Indian citizens working in recognized academic/research institutions in India with MBBS/BDS/MVSc/MSc/MPharma/MTech (or equivalent) with PhD in biomedical/health research. Minimum 3 years of teaching/research experience after required qualification and should not have availed a similar Government fellowship in the last 3 years

Age Limit: Below 45 years

Duration: 6 to 12 months

Financial Support: USD 3000 per month (including accommodation and living expenses) with return economy class airfare (as per GoI norms). Contingency support: Up to INR 75,000 (visa, travel, local expenses) and up to INR 20,000 (overseas medical insurance)

Budget: It contribute towards travel costs and subsistence of the fellow but not of any dependents. (The duration of the project is up to 3 months)
